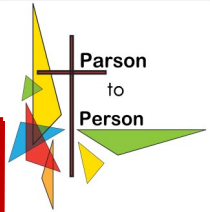

I love the responsiveness of congregations! Throughout my years as a pastor people have responded on Sunday mornings to me and it is a great thing. One year some time ago, following the conclusion of the 8:30 a.m. worship service, Jan Haga came to me and gave me a slip of paper. That Sunday's sermon dealt with the Lord's Prayer and I indicated how Jesus viewed prayer as a relational matter. Missing prayer helps us miss opportunities to grow in our relationship with God. I then shared some of the things Jesus indicated about prayer. The slip of paper Jan gave me had these words written on them: "Rules without relationship result in resentment."

I have thought about that phrase and it indicates to me why some folks have some difficulty with God and the church. The "Do" and "Don't" of living will not always make sense independent of a relationship with God. The Truth God speaks through Scripture will have far greater "edge" to it without a relationship with God. Faith becomes an occasional "yes" item when we feel the need of spiritual help if we do not have the kind of relationship with God that reminds us that God walks with us and talks with us and watches over us everyday.

God is not just a "rule-giver." God cares for each of us and desires life for us to be abundant. God's hand seeks to bring that which is good to our lives. As Jesus said, "No one asking a parent for a fish will be given a snake." The key is relationship. The Lord's Prayer gives us that. We start with *"Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our debts (sins) as we have forgiven our debtors (those who sin against us). Lead us not into temptation but save us from the time of trial. For thine is the Kingdom and the power and the glory. Amen."* The word "I" is not in the Lord's Prayer. It is a relational prayer to God where we ask God to teach us specific things.

Remember what Jesus had to say about prayer. It becomes hypocritical when it becomes a spectacle...especially when people love to do it in public and love the sound of their own voice. When prayer is used to laud one's faith as stronger and better than others, it is the prayer of a hypocrite. Do not use empty phrases...using 100 words when 10 will suffice. Remember, God is not fooled by pretty words nor coerced by empty phrases. Prayer is our time to Ask for God to remember what is on our hearts, to Seek God's help and strength, and to Knock on the door of heaven as children who have open access to God anytime, any day, any place.

Prayer is a relationship with God. Why not use February as a good time to begin making prayer an active portion of each day. John Wesley recommended 4:00 a.m. to the people called Methodists because nothing else is demanding our time at that hour.

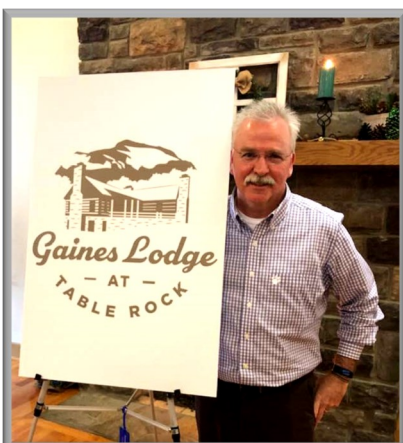

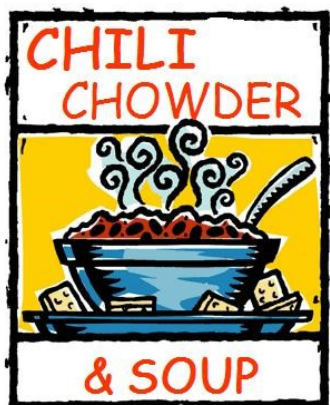

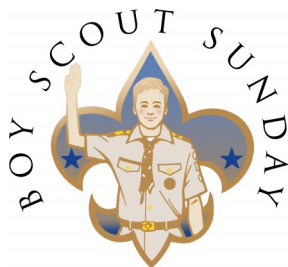
*For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, Matthew 25:35*

The Scout Sunday tradition was started to make people in houses of worship aware of Scouting, and to allow Scouts to live out their "Duty to God" pledged each week.



The Scout Law says that a "Scout is Reverent" and the Scouts of all ages promise to do their "Duty to God". These values strengthen youth character in their family, community and faith.

Scouting Sunday offers an excellent opportunity for the local congregation to recognize the Scouting program, the Scouts, and their leaders as an integral and intentional part of the Church's ministry. The Boy and Cub Scouts troops that meet at LUMC are participating in the 11 am traditional worship service on February 10. They will serve as ushers, acolyte, and lead certain parts of the worship service.



Our church support of the Snack Sack Ministry is very strong. You support this program with your time by packing the meals, unloading the delivery trucks and delivering the meals to our schools. Most of all your donations allow the purchase of the food that we deliver, the materials that we use to carry the food to each school and the bags that each child uses to carry the food home. Without each of you, Snack Sack would not be successfully feeding **525** students in 10 schools in 2 Districts each week.

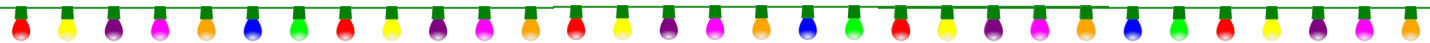


**KidsWay & Breakout!** Wednesday Night activities 6:15-7:15 pm.

We all have giants in our lives that creep in and take over. Giants like rejection, anxiety, fear, anger, and addiction. These adversaries establish a foothold, and before we know it we are tolerating something that is diminishing the glory of God in our lives and holding us back from the freedom that Jesus intends for us. So how do we break out of these patterns once and for all? Put aside what you may think about the classic David vs. Goliath story. In Goliath Must Fall, author Louis Giglio shows us how to dwell on the size of our God, not the height of our giants. Once we understand the source of our giants, we can ensure that whatever our affliction is, it can, will, and must fall down with the power of Jesus.

**Sunday School**— join us at 9:45 am. We all meet downstairs in the main youth space in the ministry center for prayers and announcements. Then, we break up for respective studies. Middle schoolers meet in youth room and High schoolers meet across the hall in MC015
