Throughout the month of October, LUMC will continue our worship series on Matthew 5 - The Beatitudes. In addition to learning about Jesus' lessons on living within the Kingdom of God rather than the kingdoms of this world, we will celebrate the following: Oct. 4 - World Communion Sunday; Oct. 11th - Pastor Jim brings our message on purity of heart; Oct. 18th we'll be challenged to live our lives as peacemakers; and on Oct. 25th we'll enjoy a Blessing of our Prayer Shawls. Please join us either in person or livestream!

VESPERS

Vespers is a sunset evening prayer service in the Orthodox, Roman Catholic, and Eastern Catholic, Anglican, & Lutheran liturgies of the canonical hours. The word comes from the Greek, hespera, & the Latin, vesper, meaning "evening". It is also referred to in the Anglican tradition as evening prayer or evensong. The term, used to describe evening services, is also used in some Protestant denominations.

We gather for Vespers every Wednesday evening at 6:30pm in the Ministry Center. Casual attire is encouraged. Face coverings are required. And social distancing is practiced. There is no limit on participants since we are gathering in the Ministry Center. Each Wednesday service lasts about 30 minutes and includes opportunities for song,

Scripture, prayer and quiet reflection. Please join us!

Snack Sack

School is back in session and we are gearing up for feeding 500+ students again this year. Harvest Hope has delivered our first inventory of food for October. Our food from Harvest Hope is prepackaged when delivered. This speeds up and limits the handling of food items. But this change also brings an increased cost! We now pay \$6 per student per week for the Harvest Hope food. We expect 32 weeks of feeding, starting with 500 students for an approximate cost of \$96,000. These numbers will change based on student counts. We thank you for your continued support of our Snack Sack Ministry.
