PASTOR

SPRINGING INTO THE FALL!

Sounds a little backwards, doesn't it?! But that's exactly what we are planning to do with our upcoming Fall ministries and activities at LUMC!

There were so many beloved events and celebrations (including worship!) that we had to forego in the Spring, due to the spread of the coronavirus pandemic, and hence, as we move into the Fall season, I hope we can do so with an eager spring in our step, and a willing attitude to experience new beginnings in a variety of arenas!

In addition to our new small group studies and our new midweek worship opportunity, September will also bring the start of brand new Children's Ministries activities, as well as our Jr. and Sr. MYF season kick-offs! Additionally, you will see some upcoming changes in our worship format.

Beginning Sunday, Sept. 6th, LUMC will begin to offer two Sunday worship opportunities. A traditional worship will be offered at 9AM, and as we have done in the past, a contemporary service will be offered at 11AM. Both services will be held in the LUMC Ministry Center. The 10AM-11AM time slot will be used to clean and disinfect the Ministry Center in accordance with CDC guidelines.

Additional changes you will see with this new Sunday format, are as follows: both services will include the same Scripture lesson, sermon, and some liturgy. Pastor Kim and Pastor Jim will be present in and lead both worship services. Traditional music and hymns will be offered at the 9AM service. Praise and Worship music will be offered at the 11AM service. Face coverings will be required for worship. And social distancing will still be observed via the current seating arrangement.

Some of our LUMC family and friends have inquired as to when we might be able to return to the LUMC sanctuary for worship. According to a recent study conducted jointly by both the University of Maryland and the University of Colorado, based on the transmission of aerosol particles in the air, a conclusion was drawn that the safest "indoor locations" to meet in the midst of current pandemic conditions are any facilities which offer overhead or raised ventilation systems. The LUMC Ministry Center has an overhead ventilation system. The LUMC sanctuary has a floor level ventilation system. The study also mentioned that in those cases where there are no other options of meeting location except for floor ventilation system spaces, then windows need to be opened. As most of you know, the windows in the LUMC sanctuary cannot be opened. For these two reasons, as well as the additional need for social distancing practices, LUMC worshipers will continue to meet for both worship services in the Ministry Center.

In preparation for this change of worship schedule, we will need to return to a rotational schedule of ushers. If you have not served in several months due to the pandemic situation, and you would like to resume serving as an usher, a member of the cleaning crew, a greeter, etc., please contact Rick Thain and/or Connie Cooper. They would be happy to hear from you as well as add your name to the service schedule!






PLEASE JOIN US FOR WORSHIP IN SEPTEMBER




are able, please come to worship on the 13th prepared to give generously to Epworth!





VESPERS TO BEGIN WEDNESDAY, SEPT. 9TH!!!




Beginning Wednesday, Sept. 9th, LUMC will be offering a mid-week opportunity to gather for prayer, Scripture reflection, and quiet song.

Vespers is a sunset evening prayer service in the Orthodox, Roman Catholic, and Eastern Catholic, Anglican, and Lutheran liturgies of the canonical hours. The word comes from the Greek, *hespera*, and the Latin, *vesper*, meaning "evening". It is also referred to in the Anglican tradition as evening prayer or evensong. The term is also used in some Protestant denominations to describe evening services.

We will gather for Vespers every Wednesday evening at 6:30PM in the Ministry Center. Casual attire is encouraged. Face coverings will be required. And social distancing will be practiced. There will be no limit on participants as we will be gathering in the Ministry Center.

Each Wednesday service will last approximately 30 minutes and include opportunities for song, Scripture, prayer, and quiet reflection. We look forward to gathering together for this uniquely spiritual worship experience.


No books are required for this Study. Please bring your favorite version of the Bible, a notebook, and a willingness to share thoughts and ideas. Hope to see you there!


Dear LUMC Members,

Starting Monday, Sept. 14, Pastor Jim Rogers will be leading a small group bible study on the **gospel according to Luke**. This will be a **four week study in person from 3:00 to 4:30 p.m. every Monday**, and per safety guidelines will be limited to 10 people with **social distancing and the use of masks required**.

If you are interested in learning more about Luke's story of Jesus's life and ministry, or curious to know more about what Jesus said about himself, discipleship, or the Kingdom of God, then this study is for you. **To sign up for this study, click the link from the email or come by the church office.** (Note: the \$7 you pay for the class will go to purchasing your journal which includes tax and shipping). You can find two different versions of the ESV Scripture journals on Amazon and Cokesbury.



These journals have lined blank pages on every other page and are great for note-taking, which we will be doing a lot of. Each week we will be reading six chapters. You can divide the readings each week however you want (I recommend one chapter per day). We will be cross-referencing the English Standard Version with the Bible translation of your choice that you bring to the in person study (i.e. NRSV, NKJV, NASB, CEB, THE MESSAGE, etc.).



Broadly speaking, what you can expect from this study is an in-depth look at Luke and his gospel of experiencing the truth of Jesus Christ. More specifically, through journaling and group discussions we will be asking and answering questions on certain key scriptures and themes in Luke, and our hope for the journey together with Luke will be to not only discover the same truth Luke found for his own life, but find the truth for our own daily life as well. I hope and pray you strongly consider this invitation to a life changing bible study experience.

Our food from Harvest Hope will be prepackaged when delivered. This will speed up and limit the handling of the food items. But, this change comes with a price increase for this convenience. We will pay \$6.00 per student per week for the Harvest Hope food. We expect 32 weeks of feeding, starting with 500 students for an approximate cost of \$96,000. These numbers will change based on student counts. We thank you for your continued support of our Snack Sack Ministry this school year.



The **Beatitudes** are eight blessings recounted by Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount in the Gospel of Matthew. Each is a proverb-like proclamation, without narrative. Four of the blessings also appear in the Sermon on the Plain in the Gospel of Luke, followed by four woes which mirror the blessings.



Next month, we will sponsor a Virtual Walk/Run (which will be held online) - details to come.





Church Email


