Make Christmas Merry!

There are several opportunities for our members to brighten the Christmas season for children who are less fortunate.

The **Angel Wish** Mission is a chance to provide a gift to children at Epworth Children's Home.

Please bring wishes (unwrapped toys) to the church, by Sunday, **December 6**th. Thank you!

The **Angel Tree** Mission is a chance to provide a gift to children who have an incarcerated parent. Rachel and Matt Buchanan are the coordinators for LUMC. The tree is up in the foyer between Asbury and Wesley Hall (where it always is). If you take an angel, make sure you fill out the sheet. There is a \$20 limit per child and wrapped gifts are due back to the church by Tuesday, **December 8**th. Thank you in advance for your help with this program!

Snack Sack

School is now in full swing and we are feeding 500+ students again this year. Harvest Hope has delivered our inventory of food for November. The food comes prepackaged when delivered. This speeds up and limits the handling of food items. But this change also brings an increased cost! We now pay \$6 per student per week for the Harvest Hope food. We expect 32 weeks of feeding, starting with 500 students for an approximate cost of \$96,000. These numbers will change based on student counts. We thank you for your continued support of our Snack Sack Ministry.

Lexington United Methodist Women

The LUMW are selling wooden flags and crosses. You can view them on the church website or the church Facebook page. We will be adding painted crosses on canvases very soon to the sites. The money for these items will go to LUMW missions which includes about 10 different organizations.
