THE SCOUT LAW (responsively):

L: The Scout Law is a guiding light to millions of boys and young adults throughout the world today, but the principles of the Law have been brought to us from ancient days.

“Do not testify falsely against your neighbor.” (Exodus 20:16)

P: A SCOUT IS TRUSTWORTHY.

L: “Whoever is faithful with little is also faithful with much, and the one who is dishonest with little is also dishonest with much.” (Luke 16:10)

P: A SCOUT IS LOYAL.

L: “You must not take revenge nor hold a grudge against any of your people; instead, you must love your neighbor as yourself ...” (Leviticus 19:18) “Poor persons will never disappear from the earth. That’s why I’m giving you this command: you must open your hand generously to your fellow Israelites, to the needy among you, and to the poor who live with you in your land.” (Deuteronomy 15:11)

P: A SCOUT IS HELPFUL.

L: “Love each other like the members of your family. Be the best at showing honor to each other.” (Romans 12:10) “Look how good and pleasing it is when families live together as one!” (Psalm 133:1)

P: A SCOUT IS FRIENDLY.

L: “Don’t let any foul words come out of your mouth. Only say what is helpful when it is needed for building up the community so that it benefits those who hear what you say.” (Ephesians 4:29)

P: A SCOUT IS COURTEOUS.

L: “The righteous care about their livestock’s needs, but even the compassion of the wicked is cruel.” (Proverbs 12:10)

P: A SCOUT IS KIND.

L: “As for children, obey your parents in the Lord, because it is right. The commandment – Honor your father and mother – is the first one with a promise attached: so that things will go well for you, and you will live for a long time in the land.” (Ephesians 6:1-3)

P: A SCOUT IS OBEDIENT.

L: “A joyful heart brightens one’s face, but a troubled heart breaks the spirit. An understanding heart seeks knowledge, but fools feed on folly. All the days of the needy are hard, but a happy heart has a continual feast.” (Proverbs 15:13-15)

P: A SCOUT IS CHEERFUL.

L: “Go to the ant, you lazy person; observe its ways and grow wise. The ant has no commander, officer, or ruler. Even so, it gets its food in summer; gathers its provisions at harvest.” (Proverbs 6:6-8)

P: A SCOUT IS THRIFTY.

L: “Be strong! Be fearless! Don’t be afraid and don’t be scared by your enemies, because the Lord your God is the one who marches with you. He won’t let you down, and he won’t abandon you.” (Deuteronomy 31:6)

P: A SCOUT IS BRAVE.

L: “Who can ascend the Lord’s mountain? Who can stand in his holy sanctuary? Only the one with clean hands and a pure heart; the one who hasn’t made false promises, the one who hasn’t sworn dishonestly. That kind of person receives blessings from the Lord and righteousness from the God who saves.” (Psalm 24:3-5)

P: A SCOUT IS CLEAN.

L: “And you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your being, with all your mind, and with all your strength.” (Mark 12:30)

P: A SCOUT IS REVERENT; HE IS REVERENT TOWARD GOD. HE IS FAITHFUL IN HIS RELIGIOUS DUTIES AND RESPECTS THE CONVICTIONS OF OTHERS IN MATTERS OF CUSTOM AND RELIGION.
