Description of duties

- Member will assist in the planning and implementation of congregational and community action to care for the Earth and renew resources.
- Member will promote understanding of the theological and biblical foundations for environmental awareness and Christian responsibility for Earth stewardship.
- Member will work with others to provide opportunities for people in the congregation
 and community to learn about issues and actions that have an impact on the health and
 future of the planet.
- Member may assist in planning events to support Earth Advocacy that may include celebration of annual Earth Day, Arbor Day, and/or other efforts for local and community environmental awareness.
- Member will connect with organizations, people, and resources in and beyond the congregation that are concerned with environmental issues.

• Member will work to identify areas where Lexington United Methodist Church can promote earth stewardship and minimize our "footprint" on the earth.

Budget Requirements

Budgetary impact, may require <\$100 - \$500 for training, videos, recycling containers.

Annual Charge Conference Attendance

The annual Charge Conference meeting is an important connectional meeting between our church and the conference. For information and in support of your church and this ministry you should make every effort to attend this meeting.

Time requirements

The time required depends on the number and complexity of projects/events planned. These projects will be determined by the team. Duties can be divided among several team members. Time commitment- with meetings, training, projects, and community events -could average from 5-10 hours per quarter.

Term

The earth advocacy team leader should commit to serving for one year; he or she may volunteer to serve for additional one-year terms thereafter.
