Christians today are wringing their hands over the church's declining influence, even as we become stuck in defending and protecting the church's traditions. So, is there a way through this dilemma?

Well, perhaps we can find our answer in Paul's letter to the church in Galatia! According to theologian Elaine Heath, Galatians can help us Christians navigate the rapid culture shifts in which we find ourselves. We can learn from Paul how to be open to the Holy Spirit who gifts and calls people to apostolic, prophetic, and evangelistic ministry that looks VERY DIFFERENT from what we in the inherited American church are used to.

Rather than polarizing ourselves between the traditional church and the other emerging forms of church, we can learn from Paul, to honor the revelation (literally, the revealing) of Jesus Christ wherever that happens, especially

among marginalized people whom Jesus called "the least of these".

NEXT STEPS IN LUMC'S RETURN TO CHURCH PROCESS

After a lengthy and lively discussion at LUMC's most recent Church Council meeting May 25th, a decision was made to re-enter the LUMC sanctuary. This decision by the Church Council came following a recommendation by LUMC's Covid-19 Committee. Recent updates by the CDC and the South Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church have brought us to the long-awaited time when we can relax many of our Covid-19 proto-

cols. From the outset of the Pandemic, LUMC's Covid-19 protocols have been focused on operating as normally as possible while making Lexington UMC a safe place to worship, to be in ministry, and to serve God and neighbor. We have sought to love our neighbor as ourselves by focusing on not excluding anyone and keeping the most vulnerable safe. As we take this much anticipated Next Step of re-entering our beloved LUMC sanctuary, the 28 Church Council members in attendance at the May 25th meeting voted 27-1 in favor of the following statement regarding LUMC's Next Steps protocol:

The wearing of face coverings is still recommended to protect members of Lexington United Methodist Church who are not fully vaccinated because of personal, age related, or health related reasons.

As we move forward over our shared fellowship as a family of faith, please be aware of these additional changes to LUMC's prior Covid-19 practices and protocols: Three Sunday worship services will be offered each week—8:30am – Traditional Worship in Sanctuary; 11am – Contemporary Worship in Ministry Center/Wesley Hall; 11am – Traditional Worship in Sanctuary

Seating at all worship services will be at the discretion of those in attendance. However, we ask worship attendees to maintain a three foot interval (a full arm's length) from those around you if you do not share the same household. We ask that physical contact (hugs, handshakes, etc.) be limited to protect everyone. Due to the distance between the worship activity space and the congregational seating, all worship leaders will remove their masks when performing worship activities such as speaking, singing, etc.


An **ionizer was installed** on May 7th in the LUMC sanctuary to enhance the flow of fresh air. Additionally, the HVAC system in the sanctuary will be set on FAN mode during all activities within the sanctuary. Bulletins, hymnals, and songbooks will be available at our worship services. Attendance registration pads will be available in the pews. Offering plates will be distributed during the Offertory. Holy Communion will be served at frequent intervals continuing to use the individual pre-packaged elements. One Traditional worship service and one Contemporary worship service will be live-streamed weekly.

Adult Sunday School classes are currently being offered per the arrangements of each individual class. No Children's Sunday School classes are being offered at this time. However, Children's Church is offered during the 11am worship services. Additionally, Nursery care is offered during the 11am worship services. Adults volunteering in the Nursery will continue to wear face coverings as Nursery-aged children cannot yet be vaccinated and they are not yet old enough to wear masks. Each child's temperature will be checked upon arrival and if any child's temperature registers above 99.8 degrees, that child will not be allowed to stay in the Nursery.

Sweet, sweet spirit



"Finally," Akers recalled, "I was compelled to say to the choir, 'We have to go. I hate to leave this room and I know you hate to leave, but you know we do have to go to the service.

But there is such a sweet, sweet Spirit in this place."

One choir director's insistence that her singers weren't prayed up enough resulted in a beloved United Methodist hymn, "Sweet, Sweet Spirit."

On a Sunday morning in 1962, the story goes, <u>Doris Mae Akers</u> would not dismiss the choir members, feeling that they needed to spend more time praying before entering the worship service.

"You are not ready to go in," she is quoted as saying, when discussing the origin of no. 334 in "The United Methodist Hymnal."

As was the custom, Akers, director of the Sky Pilot Choir in Los Angeles, prayed with choir members before every performance, asking God to bless their songs.

This particular morning, she asked her choir members to pray again. As they fervently prayed, she hesitated to stop the impromptu prayer meeting, although the pastor was waiting on them before starting the service. The phrase stayed with Akers and she wrote the hymn the next day.

The refrain, "Sweet Holy Spirit, Sweet heavenly Dove," was inspired by Matthew 3;16-17, Akers said. The scripture, about Jesus' baptism, reads, "he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove, and lighting upon him; And lo a voice from heaven, saying, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." (KJV)

An instant hit

"Sweet, Sweet Spirit" was added to the "The United Methodist Hymnal" in 1989, immediately becoming a favorite.






