THANK YOU, GOD, FOR YOUR GIFT TO US!

A cartoon from a few years ago showed a woman saying to her husband ... "Good grief, Henry, here's Christmas at our throats again!"

Amid the preparations for Christmas each year, there always seems to be a few voices like that woman's, proclaiming a "Bah! Humbug!" attitude on the whole celebration. And if the truth be known, some of us probably feel less than excited about Christmas more often than not, ourselves! The expense, the crowds, the overindulgence, the harried schedules, and all the other trappings of modern Christmas celebrations are enough to make all of us take a jaundiced look at the season.

In the face of this all-too-frequent humbug state of affairs, it is helpful to remember that God did not send Jesus into this world to be "at our throats"! Rather, God sent his one and only Son to us to be in our hearts. And the radical difference between those two concepts defines the gap between the gloom and the glory of this season. HAVE YOU BEEN "MISSING SOMETHING" THIS FALL?

Have you been missing something this Fall ... like, maybe, a CHURCH STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN? Now, while your answer to that question is probably ... NO! ... just in case you have been wondering what happened to our 2021 LUMC Stewardship Campaign, no worries - we are doing something different this year!

Beginning with the first Sunday of Advent, LUMC started a unique Stewardship Campaign entitled ... *The Advent Conspiracy*. What an odd name for a Stewardship Campaign ... you might be saying ... and what a strange time of year to host one! But just consider this ...

Is it such a radical idea to propose that we followers of King Jesus might want to "conspire" with other like minded believers to resist what unfortunately presses in on each and every one of us during the Advent season - that is, the "pressure, pressure, pressure" to worship less, spend more, give less, and love only a few? Is it really such a radical idea to suggest that there may be a better way, a fuller, richer way to celebrate the joy of the Christmas story than to feed into the extreme consumerism that has literally hijacked this "most wonderful time of the year"?

The answer to these questions, is exactly what *The Advent Conspiracy* is all about. It will show us how to substitute compassion for consumption by practicing four simple but powerful counter cultural concepts:



Worship Fully-because Christmas begins and ends with Jesus



Spend Less-and free up your resources for things that truly matter



Give More-of your hands, your words, and your heart



Love All - including the poor, the sick, and the forgotten

Now let's be clear ... the Advent Conspiracy is not a four point checklist that tells us how to "do" stewardship. It's also not some formula or foolproof system to make our Christmas more meaningful. It is the story of the wondrous moment when God entered our world to make things right. It's all about the greatest story ever told ... and it changes everything ... including the way we celebrate our Christian faith! So our hope is that as you participate in the Advent Conspiracy throughout our 2021 Advent season, you'll discover Jesus Christ in a brand new way and be transformed by His coming into our lives once again. Because you know, the message of Jesus can still change the world, especially if all of us believers can conspire together to celebrate the REAL GOOD NEWS ... through worshiping more fully, spending less, giving more, and loving all.



Love Feast

Sunday, December 5, 2021 @6:30 PM - 7:30 PM, Sanctuary

The Love Feast, or Agape Meal, is a Christian fellowship meal recalling the meals Jesus shared with disciples during his ministry and expressing the koinonia (community, sharing, fellowship) enjoyed by the family of Christ.

Although its origins in the early church are closely interconnected with the origins of the Lord's Supper, the two services became *quite distinct and should* not be confused with each other. Celebrate the season with carols, traditional buns and coffee and a lesson.

The spiral walk will be open from 5—6pm and 6:30--7:30pm.

A spiral walk is a calm, quiet walking path similar to a labyrinth, just simplified. You are also invited to visit the reflections stations: *Waiting, Wondering, Wishing, & Wrestling*; enjoy Walking the candlelit spiral, and Worship with us. The spiral will be located outside near the preschool playground.




What happens when kids show up to perform a traditional Christmas Pageant...in their Halloween costumes?!

There will be a required dress rehearsal on Saturday, December 4, at 10am, in the Sanctuary.









Saving Faith, (rated G, 1h 45m) a family movie with a great message and great music!!!


Wednesday, December 29. Doors open at 5:00pm for BYOBB—bring your own brown bag supper. Movie will start promptly at 5:30pm.

Using his connections, that Faith knows nothing about, Uncle Donny is able to book a big time headliners for the show - Vince Gill and Amy Grant. Peter Marsh is a local business man in Clinton that has been waiting for the Ritz to go under so he can buy it cheap from the bank and sell it to a big time developer. When he hears about the Vince Gill/Amy Grant show, he pulls out all the stops to make sure the show does not go on. Uncle Donny, Faith—their friends and family pull together to make sure that they have done everything in their power to keep the doors to the Ritz Theater open, but can they succeed?

We owe gratitude to Dee and Janice Eskridge who are responsible for the Chrismons that adorn the tree in the Sanctuary. They led the construction of those in 2014. They provided instructions to a group of our talented crafty ladies who created the Chrismons you see on our tree today. Our topper was constructed and donated in 2015 by Dee Eskridge. We continue to enjoy those Chrismons which were constructed by our LUMC ladies. And, we are grateful!

All of the Chrismons are made in either white gold or in a combination of the two. Occasionally, a color can be used, for example, red for a drop of blood White – White suggests the innocence, purity, and perfection of our Savior. In our culture, it is the color of joy. Scripture often uses white to portray purity and equates it with light to denote completeness.

Gold – Gold is a symbol of the glory and majesty of God and the Son of God. Clear Lights – Clear lights symbolize Jesus as the light of the world.

Chrismon Symbols

Triquetra and Circle – Triquetra is a symbol of the trinity. Circle is a symbol of eternity.

Three Entwined Circles – A symbol for the Holy Trinity, one God in Three Persons, Each eternal, All One. Triquetra – A symbol of trinity. The three points represent Father, Son, and Holy Spirit while the continuous

interwoven line represents unity.

God's Never-ending-Love –The circle represents God's Never-ending-Love. It is a circle formed of three fish to remind us that God loves everyone.

Iota Chi – Two elements unite to form this design. The Iota (I) is the first letter of our Lord's given name Jesus in Greek. A Chi (X) is the first letter of Christ in Greek. Thus, meaning Jesus Christ.

Son of Righteousness – Christ is the light of the world. As our universe revolves around the sun, our lives should be centered around Christ.

Epiphany Star – Has five points. It represents the five wounds of Jesus on the cross.

Star of David – The six points represent six aspects of God. They are love, mercy, wisdom, majesty, power, and justice.

Cross – Is a symbol that Christians believe Jesus Christ died for everyone on the cross.

Anchor Cross (Cross of Hope) – Represents this Child is the hope of the world; or a cross rising from a crescent moon-- a symbol for our Lord's mother.

Crown – Is the symbol that Jesus is King. It shows that Christians believe Jesus is ruler over heaven and earth. Crown of Thorns – The thorns represent the suffering of Christ during the crucifixion.

Shepherd's Crook – Is a symbol that Jesus sometimes called himself a shepherd. It can also represent the shepherds who were the first people talked about the birth of Jesus.

Sandals – Sandals were worn in biblical times. Walking on the dusty roads resulted in dirty feet that led to the custom of washing the feet by servants. Also servants went barefoot, but if the servants had sandals this was a symbol of freedom.

Fish – In the early years, Christianity was an illegal religion. Because of this, the "Sign of the Fish" became a universal symbol that secretly identified believers to one another.

Dove – The symbol of peace and the Holy Spirit.

Angel – An angel is a heavenly being who serves as God's messenger. An angel conveys news, commands, or request from God to man.

Candle – Represents that Christians believe Jesus is the Light of the World.

Butterfly – Is a symbol for transformation and the immortal soul.

Heart – Is a symbol of love and reminds Christians that God is love.

Bell – Is a later western symbol that arose from church bells calling people to worship. It represents the proclamation of the Gospel of the world.

Jacob's Ladder – Represents the ladder of Jacob, Abraham's grandson, who saw it in a dream, where God was at the top and the angels were on the ladder ascending and descending.

United Methodist Cross and Flame – The Cross represents Christ and the Flame the Holy Spirit. The Flame reminds us of Pentecost when witnesses were unified by the power of the Holy Spirit.



Have you heard yet about the streaming series entitled *The Chosen*? It is a drama based on the life of Jesus of Nazareth, and is the first multi-season series about the life of Jesus. The series' creators are hoping to distinguish this new series from previous portrayals of Jesus by offering a perspective on Jesus' life "through the eyes of those who met him" and lived life with him. The first season of *The Chosen* introduces Jesus and the calling of his initial disciples. The second season focuses on the beginning of Jesus' public ministry and all that happens as word of Jesus' ministry begins to spread. In addition to VidAngel and its' own app, the series airs on several streaming services.

Beginning January 2022, a special Team-taught Small Group Study will be offered highlighting *The Chosen*. Through two identical sessions offered twice a week - **Mondays at 4pm** and **Fridays at 10am**. Requirements for this Study will include watching *The Chosen* Series' episodes before each Study gathering.

The Chosen Small Group Study will begin with an introductory session on Monday, **January 10 at 4pm OR Friday, January 14 at 10am**. Regular Study gatherings will then begin on Monday, January 24 at 4pm OR Friday, January 28 at 10am and run weekly until Monday, March 14 at 4pm OR Friday, March 18 at 10am.

During our Sunday worship gatherings all throughout the season of Advent, a small "teaser" of *The Chosen* series will be shared. These video clips come directly from *The Chosen* producers in celebration of their 2020 Christmas Special, entitled *The Shepherd*. Each Sunday you will be invited to travel with a crippled shepherd as he takes a lamb to the Temple for sacrifice; as he hears the angelic announcement of the birth of Christ; and as he comes to the stable where the Lamb of God is born. There is currently a 2021 Christmas Special offered by *The Chosen* producers, showing in area theaters beginning Dec. 1st.

The Chosen App

The Chosen is readily accessible to install from the Appstore and the Play Store globally. This Religious program permits you to look at The Chosen in a specific area free of charge rather than pay for a subscription service. There is nothing to lose since the application can be projected on your TV through Hdmi, FireTV, Chromecast, Smart Tv, Android Television or a Display port. So you may view it or out and about in a comfortable room on the couch at leisure.

The Chosen app, of course, includes extra content connected to the program, like trailers, background images, activities, and more.

Thechosen.tv


The Chosen is accessible for free viewing on thechosen.tv. Although this is a good alternative, or out and about on a TV it is much less approachable than the official app. You won't get the similar grade of streaming experiences as you might through the specialized application whenever you view it on your smartphone or cast onto a TV through your website. But if you do not have accessibility to a smartphone or computer, this is still a wonderful way to view the Biblical series.

BYUtv

The Chosen is shown on BYUtv, a US-based TV station. It is an encouraging sign for The US spectators who hope to view on a TV, but not a positive thing for those outside the United States. In addition, fewer and fewer consumers have cable TV during the streaming video era. So it is less convenient to watch at BYUtv.
