



THE VICTORY OF EASTER

Have you ever heard the term ... Christus Victor? It means ... Christ the victor ... and it is probably best illustrated in the **PASTOR** description Gospel writer Luke offers of Jesus' resurrection:

"Very early in the morning on the first day of the week, the women went to the tomb, bringing the fragrant spices they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they didn't find the body of the Lord Jesus. They didn't know what to make of this. Suddenly, two men were standing beside them in gleaming bright clothing. The women were frightened and bowed their faces toward the ground, but the men said to them, 'why do you look for the living among the dead? He isn't here, but has been raised. Remember what he told you while he was still in Galilee, that the Human One must be handed over to sinners, be crucified, and on the third day rise again?"

Luke 24:1-7 CEB

Before we move away from this proclamation of the Good News, I want you to think about a couple of questions for your life, right now. Question number 1 what are the stones that are blocking your pathway to a free and full life? Question number 2 - Is there anything in your life that is causing you to feel utterly defeated? Well, I hope you will let the victory of Easter and Christ's victory of resurrection remind you that whatever gigantic obstacles you face from day to day, God can roll away the stone! Through the victory of the resurrection, God rolled away not just the stone that blocked the entrance to the tomb on that first Easter morning, but God can roll away every single stone that blocks peace and love and joy from our human hearts. Absolutely any stone that any one of us cannot budge with our own efforts or by our own accord, God can move!!!

God's victory over death I imagine is the very thing that inspired the Apostle Paul to write to the Corinthian church - "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting? The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ!" (1st Cor. 15:55-57) Most certainly, there is no greater stone that we face, no greater force that defeats us as human beings, than the cold, hard reality of death. Every other thing we face in life pales in comparison to that reality! But the Apostle Paul savs in no uncertain terms that God has defeated death. God has removed death's sting. Christ has the victory! Christus Victor!

You may recall that the Apostle Paul's words to the church in Corinth were so motivational for great Methodist hymn writer Charles Wesley, that he penned one of the greatest Easter hymns of our Christian faith - "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today". Two stanzas in particular capture the glorious triumph of Jesus over the grave: Lives again, our glorious King, Alleluia! Where O death is now thy sting? Alleluia! Once he died our souls to save! Alleluia! Where's thy victory, boasting grave? Alleluia! Soar we now where Christ has led. Alleluia! Following our exalted head. Alleluia! Made like him, like him we rise! Alleluia! Ours the cross, the grave, the skies! Alleluia!

No question, the story of the resurrection is a story of victory! And it is a story of how WE are victorious, not through our own actions, but through what God has done! Christus Victor! Christus Victor is the "Ultimate Alleluia" of what God can do ... something that we can never do ourselves! So may we, not just on Easter Sunday, but every day from that moment forward, receive God's victory as a gift for ourselves. And in receiving that gift, let us live every day of our lives in victory!

Happy Resurrection Day ... and every day beyond! - Pastor Kim

—we invite you to visit and give walking the labyrinth a try, if you haven't already. Allow yourself to be present and walk the labyrinth in the way you think will work best for you. God bless you. We hope you have a wonderful experience.





A labyrinth differs from a maze in that there is only one way in and one way out. It has one continuous path that twists and turns, eventually leading to the center. There are no dead ends. There is nothing to figure out as you walk. You simply follow the path to the center and then retrace the same path back out. The point is not disorientation, but orientation.

Volunteers are needed for setting up the labyrinth following the egg hunt on 4/10 and taking it down on 4/15 at 6pm. You will be shown how to do this. The more the merrier, and makes quick work.

Canned foods need to be pop top cans.



If you were in attendance, or watched, any of our three worship celebrations on Sunday, March 20, you heard the announcement from LUMC SPRC Chair Tim Chandler that I am retiring from full time itinerant ministry in the South Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church. To use a phrase that has become uber popular in our new COVID culture, I am labeling this retirement - *Hybrid Retirement*.

Retirement I have served God within the stained-glass walls of the local church for 32 years now - it's the only vocation I have ever known! I feel so very

blessed by the abundant and diverse opportunities I have had over these years to make an inspired difference in the faith lives of so many believers and former unbelievers! It's been a privilege! But now I am being called by God to do "even greater things than these" (John 14:12) beyond the corporate and physical structure of the local church. There are so many needs "out there" in our world - struggles and challenges facing so many people who don't feel comfortable even crossing the threshold of a church entryway! And hence, God is calling me to a new phase of ministry which involves continuing to be the hands and feet and heart of Jesus Christ "out there" - in our neighborhoods and in our communities.

In this new God endeavor, I will be relocating to Aiken, South Carolina to be more available to my parents so that whenever that time comes when they can no longer "go out and about on their next adventure", I will be closer and more able to assist them in their inevitable journey of advanced aging. And since I have already moved a total of 9 times in my 32 years of ministry, I'm thinking I'd rather just transition once in my *hybrid retirement* phase before moving again to the mountains or to the sea (or both!) once I reach full retirement age

So, there it is - a brief capsule summary of what God is calling me to do and where God is calling me to be in this next awesome phase of my blessed life! But for those of you who prefer the nuts and bolts/black and white/facts and figures information of any particular scenario, here is an explanation of my retirement status directly out of the 2016 United Methodist Book of Discipline: PP357:2.b - "With Thirty Years of Service or at Age Sixty-two: At their own request and by vote of the clergy members in full connection, any clergy member who will have attained age sixty two on or before July 1 in the year in which the session of the annual conference is held or will have completed thirty years of service under appointment as an ordained minister; or a local pastor with pension credit for service before 1982 or with full participation in the Comprehensive Protection Plan since 1981; as of the conference session may be placed in the retired relation with an annuity claim for an actuarially reduced pension."

Just in case you overlooked it in that description, the "schedule" for retiring clergy runs the same as for appointed clergy, i.e. via the United Methodist Conference year. Consequently, the transition of Senior Pastors at LUMC will be effective on July 1, 2022. Let us be in prayer as individuals and as a community of faith for our respective futures in ministry in Christ's Name! - Pastor Kim






