THE CROSS OF RESURRECTION



FROM OUR
PASTOR

"I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses all knowledge, so that you may be filled with the fullness of God." Ephesians 3:18-19

I have a colleague who uses words and phrases from the Lord's Prayer to help him in prayer and meditation. He begins ... *"Our Father"* ... and then he writes the words on paper and places the paper where he will see it most often throughout the week. For several days in a row, my colleague lets those words sink into his thoughts so that he is eventually brought to whatever images and truths those words reveal.

I have tried my colleague's prayer method, but I have found that I need an object or some image to assist me in praying and meditating. rather than just occasionally glancing at some key words on a page. And if you've watched any of the Study videos I post, you would quickly figure out that for me, that primary object/image is the cross. When I attempt to tackle a selected prayer exercise and/or when I am presenting a Study medita-

tion, I find a cross ... either a life-size one on a stand, a brass one on an altar, or maybe just a hand held pocket cross ... and I offer my prayer/lead my Study with the central focus being on that particular object.

All throughout our journey of Holy Week, we were called numerous times, as a faith community, to allow our focus to be on the cross ... the old rugged cross, the cross carried up to Golgotha's Hill, the cross standing in between two thieves, and the empty cross. But I got to wondering ... especially in this Eastertide season ... how much we really focus on the cross when it's NOT the center of our season of worship? In other words, on any given day, at any random time, how often do you intentionally focus on the cross as the central image of your faith, and in doing that, offer God a word of thanks for all that God has done for us through the cross of Christ Jesus?

In pondering these questions over the past few days since our celebration of Resurrection Sunday, I have come upon a whole new perspective on the cross - a perspective that ministers to me every single day, and every single moment, no matter what the liturgical

season. So when you have another free moment, take this article with you, and do this little exercise with me ...

Find a favorite cross of yours ... and depending upon its' size, either stand in front of it, or hold it in your hand. Notice, first, that the cross points down. That tells me that, no matter how low we sink ... no matter how far we stray from God, God's love can reach down and rescue us. Most of us know what the Apostle's Creed says ... *"He descended into hell"*. The "He" in that sentence is Jesus Christ, and thus, I am assured that no matter how far I sink - even to the depths of hell - God's love reaches me even there! And I will emerge victorious!

Now ... take a moment to look at the cross beam of the cross you are using as your object lesson ... each side of the cross beam points outward, does it not? And what that tells me, again about the love of God, is that God's love extends to all. God's love is inclusive, not exclusive. *"For God so loved the world"* ... have you ever considered the fact that it was no mere accident that that arms of Christ were stretched out over the full length of the

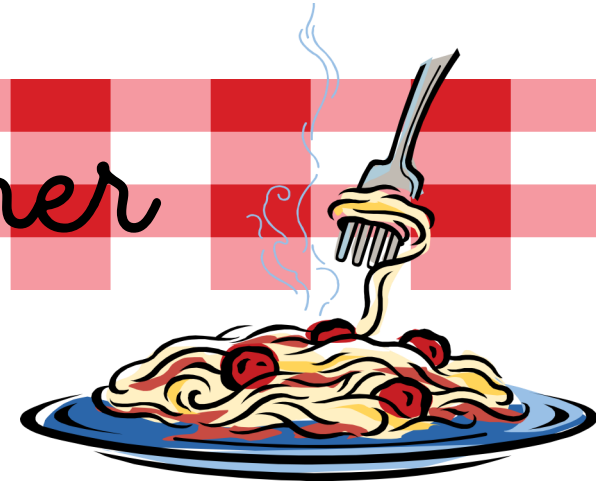

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cross? Indeed, as He was hanging there dying for our sins, Jesus was looking out over the whole world, to every nation and every generation, and his arms were embracing us all.

Last ... and certainly not least ... look at how the cross points up. Again, what that tells me about the love of God, is that God's love continues all the way into everlasting life! Yes! God's love lasts forever!

Most all of you who are reading this have been to at least one funeral ... and at least one graveside service. I'm not sure if this was part of the Committal service you attended, but when I lead a burial service, I ask the Funeral Director to pour some dirt into the grave as I utter the words ... *"ashes to ashes, dust to dust"*. But the Funeral Director's instructions are more detailed than merely shoveling a couple of scoops into the hole! Rather, I ask the Funeral Director to pour one long strand of dirt down the length of the grave. And then I ask him/her to pour a second shorter strand of dirt horizontally across the grave.

Did you visualize, in your mind right then, the image of the cross? How appropriate ... that through the power of the resurrection, even unto death, the cross becomes a symbol of love that not even death can destroy! Alleluia! Nothing, not even death, can take us away from the love of God that is ours through Christ Jesus! Alleluia, and Amen!

Please pray with me ...

Holy God, bring before our eyes each day the cross of Christ, so that throughout the day, whether we look down, around, or up, we might be reminded that there is absolutely no place any of us can ever be where your love cannot reach and hold us. Amen.

Children's Home

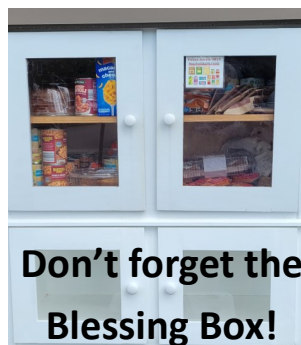

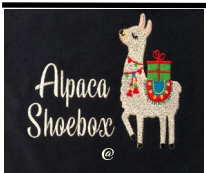

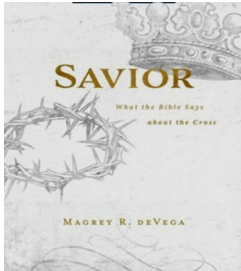

ONLINE STUDY - SAVIOR: WHAT THE BIBLE SAYS ABOUT THE CROSS



Do you believe that our relationship with God changes over time? Boy, I sure do ... and I say that with full confidence, because I've lived it personally! I also say "Yes it does" quite boldly, because I strongly

believe that not only is our relationship with God "allowed" to change over time, it's "expected" to!

Now just to be clear, our relationship with God changes over time not necessarily because God changes, but because we do! Our situations change. We learn and gain new experiences. We develop new habits and relationships. And each time those things happen, our understanding of

God enters a critical phase - either we begin to question what we've once believed, or we begin to ask whether or not we should continue to believe anymore!

Most certainly, stretching our belief and enduring changes in our relationship with God are both painful and challenging. But hopefully, more often than not, those necessary changes provide the Holy Spirit with an opportunity to push us into even broader, deeper, and richer understandings of our faith!

Savior: What the Bible Says about the Cross is a study that focuses on one of the most common areas of the Christian faith where we experience multiple growth spurts ... the work of Jesus on the cross. And this Study attempts to take us to "the next level" of growth by presenting difficult questions for us to ponder,

such as: Why did Jesus have to die?; and, How exactly does Jesus save us?; and, What does the cross mean for our belief and for our behavior?

Are you intrigued yet? Are you feeling challenged in your thinking? Are some brand new (or old) faith questions starting to erupt in your brain? Well please tune in to the LUMC website every week (at your leisure) to join me in this Study. Each of the six weeks' sessions will be posted around mid-week. 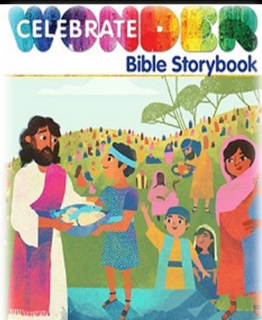
