Compassion Camp is a program where kids, families, and church communities explore what it means to have compassion for ourselves, others, and the world.

Compassion Camp is meant to be **intergenerational** to reflect the diverse body of Christ. As we all know, folks are on the move this summer with activities. So we are going to try something different:

Compassion Camp is going to be a **Sunday/Wednesday experience**. On the Sundays, listed at

left, the Worship Services will have a Youth Bible story skit during the children's video moment and we will have a lovingkindness practice.

At **10am**, on these Sundays, during Sunday School hour, those who want to join in will come together for a **Compassion in Action** project in the "connector" space—between Asbury and Wesley.

On the Wednesdays listed at left, at 6:30pm in Wesley Hall, there will be a *Bible story skit; movement*—physical engagement to connect our minds, bodies, and spirits with God, with some basic yoga poses, connecting Compassion Camp's main themes with our lives; and a *lovingkindness practice*: This practice will help participants develop the skills and mindset necessary to practice compassion.

- ☺ You can get connected by sharing lovingkindness together as the body of Christ.

- Residents are limited to 8 total gallons of paint for disposal at HHW collection events. Paint should be wet and uncontaminated. If drying process has started, continue to mix with cat litter and expose to air until completely dried. Once COMPLETELY dry, container can be placed in household garbage.
- Reminder that any lithium ion or rechargeable batteries (including button batteries), need to be brought to a Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) event to be properly disposed of. Batteries placed in household trash containers cause fires if the elements contact any metal. When in doubt, bring it to a HHW collection event.
- Pick up your Lexington County Compost bin for only \$65.00!
- Get a free thermometer and kitchen compost mini bin (*with purchase while supplies last, one per household*) when you watch our video and take our online backyard composting quiz.
