



Compassion Camp Continues— Compassion Camp is meant to be intergenerational to reflect the body of Christ. Folks are on the move this summer with activities, so, we are trying something different:

Compassion Camp is on Sunday & Wednesday.

On the Sundays, listed at right, the Worship Services will have a Youth Bible story skit during the children's video moment and we will have a lovingkindness practice.

At 10am, on Sunday, during Sunday School hour, those who want to join in will come together for a *Compassion in Action* project in the "connector" space—between Asbury and Wesley.

On Wednesday, at 6:30pm in Wesley Hall, there will be a *Bible story skit*; *movement*—physical engagement to connect our minds, bodies, and spirits with God; and a *lovingkindness practice*: This practice will help you develop your talents to practice compassion.

On August 7, during Compassion Camp, we are going to learn about and support Sole Stepping, a Batesburg, SC mission. One of the ways we are supporting this important mission is by accepting their summer challenge of **donating \$5 per person** to help buy shoes for local school children. Or sponsor a child, **\$25 per child**, which purchases socks and shoes. Will you accept this challenge by giving \$5 per family member, or \$25? If you cannot, please give what you can.

During Compassion Camp we are making *Notes of Encouragement*, penning a short note to encourage the children who receive the shoes. This is note which is given to each child on Distribution Day.

SOLE Stepping is a certified 501(c)3 nonprofit organization that provides new shoes and socks to elementary school students in Lexington County, South Carolina. Shoes are often the most visible sign of poverty. With 1 in 5 children living in poverty, that's a reality that impacts every school district in America. The simple gift of a new pair of shoes can positively change a child's world. That's why we never distribute previously-owned shoes to our children in our sponsored schools.

Since 2016, we have provided more than 6,000 pairs of shoes to elementary school children in the Midlands of South Carolina.

So, I say thank you for the wonderful welcome you have extended to me and my family amid all that you are doing. I look forward to working alongside you as we fulfill your mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

Your church has developed a wonderful vision to fulfill your mission. That vision is rooted in the acronym "SEE" which has three parts: stewardship, engagement, and education. You have worded it this way: "We will generously and lovingly share our fiscal and physical gifts (Stewardship); We will come together to joyfully serve God, inspire, and accompany one another in our spiritual journey (Engagement); We will intentionally study scripture and communicate effectively to lead others to Christ (Education).

That vision statement, which you have developed over the years, is probably one of the best worded ones I know of for any church I've been involved with. It incorporates so many of the attributes that Jesus developed in the disciples. The early church that we read of in the book of Acts certainly prioritized so much of what you say is important to your vision in accomplishing your mission within this community. One of the most important ways I have witnessed you living out your vision is in a growing volunteer effort. Your church has a very good reputation as being laity strong, rather than pastor-centered. I think this is visible in the way your church has remained well-focused even during multiple changes in staff, including several pastoral changes at different levels.

You, as a living body of Jesus' followers, haven't allowed yourselves to be distracted by changes and outside events, which is quite remarkable. I think that is a very good indicator of a blessed future for your mission and vision as ministers of Christ. Many of you have openly approached me with ideas of how your church can continue in your strong tradition as the hands and feet of Jesus, and I welcome that. Not everyone has the same exact idea on what is important in mission and ministry, but you have been patient with each other, the staff, and with me also. Thank you for that patience. Key elements in the growth of your church will continue to be volunteers to continue ministry, and regular tithing to fund your missions. Please continue to generously give you time and tithes to your church to continue the work of Jesus in your community.



Children's Church will resume with a new format in August.


We ARE still having Sunday School—that means we need volunteers!



- Residents are limited to 8 total gallons of paint for disposal at HHW collection events. Paint should be wet and uncontaminated. If drying process has started, continue to mix with cat litter and expose to air until completely dried. Once COMPLETELY dry, container can be placed in household garbage.
- Reminder that any lithium ion or rechargeable batteries (including button batteries), need to be brought to a Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) event to be properly disposed of. Batteries placed in household trash containers cause fires if the elements contact any metal. When in doubt, bring it to a HHW collection event.
 - Pick up your Lexington County Compost bin for only \$65.00!
 - Get a free thermometer and kitchen compost mini bin (*with purchase while supplies last, one per household*) when you watch our video and take our online backyard composting quiz.
