


of thanks for your abundant generosity in presenting me with the

Altar Flower Arrangements





Thanks to Stephanie Thain we now have 3 sets of silk flower arrangements. These arrangements are stored and kept at the church for future choices to honor or remember someone. The pictures show the three choices: a set with red flowers, a set with yellow sunflowers or the newest set with purple flowers.

We asked Stephanie to design these silk flower arrangements to provide additional choices for Altar flowers to enhance our worship setting. You may choose one of the sets of silk arrangements to honor or remember someone just as you would if you choose to purchase florist flowers.

Here is how it works:

- 1) Choose one to these sets of silk Altar flower arrangements and mark your name on the Flower Calendar by a date you would like. Note beside your name **red silk**, **yellow silk** or **purple silk**. The Sanctuary Stewards for the month will then know which set of arrangements is your preference and will place that set at the altar.
- 2) You give a donation such as \$25 by making your check to LUMC and mark on the check's notation line <u>Sanctuary/ Flower Fund</u>.
- 3) Call Diane to let her know who you would like the flowers for the donation to be used to honor or remember. This will be stated in the bulletin for that Sunday. Fund. Our flowers today are in honor / memory of _____."

The donation to the Sanctuary/Flower Fund will allow us to continue to maintain the flowers, add more as needed or provide needed items in the Sanctuary. It's main purpose is to enhance our worship service by providing an alternative for altar flowers.



Live florist flowers remain an option to provide flowers in the Sanctuary. If you choose to purchase live flowers from a florist, it works as it always has. You place your name by a date on the Flower Calendar, call Diane with your information and the Sanctuary Stewards know the florist will deliver the flowers. Of course, these flowers may be taken with you.

Stephanie has also offered another alternative. She will shop for you for live flowers using your budget. These also could be used to honor or remember someone and could be then taken home with you. You would need to contact Stephanie directly for this alternative @ 803-513-2528. If this is your choice, please also place your name on the Flower Calendar by the appropriate date and indicate (Stephanie) in parenthesis. A call to Diane for the bulletin expression would be necessary as well.

- Reminder that any lithium ion or rechargeable batteries (including button batteries), need to be brought to a Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) event to be properly disposed of. Batteries placed in household trash containers cause fires if the elements contact any metal. When in doubt, bring it to a HHW collection event.
