A labyrinth is simply a place to walk and pray. There is nothing mystical about it. It gives you the freedom to walk and focus your mind on God. A labyrinth contains a single walking path to the center and then back out again. It has many turns but, unlike mazes, does not have dead ends.

One way to pray a labyrinth is to worship and praise God as you walk to the center, then pray intercessory prayer for people and concerns as you walk back to the outside. **Prayer stations** and the **Labyrinth** are ways to let you focus on what God may be saying to you in the moment.

Hours for the labyrinth during Holy Week are: Monday, Tuesday, April 3 & 4— 9 am-5 pm  
Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, April 5,6,7—9 am-6 pm. Labyrinth will be located in Wesley Hall.

Our church intends to participate in the **Lake Murray Salkehatchie from 15-22 July 2023**

Salkehatchie Summer Service is an in-state mission opportunity for youth aged 14 and older and adults. Teams repair homes of families needing help. No previous experience is needed. From Saturday to Saturday, volunteers experience more than just a week of hard work. Their dedication and love help families feel comfortable and secure in their homes.

Since 1978, Salkehatchie has been more than a church outreach program, volunteer group, or just another summer youth camp. By the numbers—**200** homes updated every summer by volunteers; **63,000** campers have participated over the past 40 years; **\$1 million** spent on construction and other supplies each summer; **6,000 families** helped since Salkehatchie began.

Salkehatchie Summer Service is a servant ministry throughout locations in South Carolina where youth and adults come together to serve the community. These volunteers, who come from different walks of life, come together to help those who are in need. By helping people help themselves provides all participants the opportunities to grow in their walk with Christ. Salkehatchie Summer Service is a Limited Liability Company under the program of the South Carolina Conference Board of Global Ministries and is overseen by a Board of Managers.

When workers commit themselves to service, they are making a covenant with God to put their own needs and desires aside. They do this by sharing their talents, love, and concern with our sisters and brothers in Christ. They work on homes where real people live. People who are created by God, that need love, a sense of ownership, an avenue for creativity, and a desire to belong.

Specific jobs you might be asked to undertake are repairing a leaky roof, putting up sheetrock, painting (inside and outside), replacing broken windows and doors, rebuilding porches, rebuilding bathrooms, digging, and stabilizing floors and walls. The work will vary slightly at each site, depending on climate and need. These services are offered at no charge to the families.

We do not mean to give the impression that the ministry is all discipline and hard work! These are included, but the ministry is exciting, creative, and something to be remembered as deeply meaningful and richly rewarding experience. The spirit is the important thing. To have a wholesome, creative and loving relationship with other people is a tremendous significance in the overall success of the ministry. One can have the pleasure of knowing that there is not made-work! Whatever one is asked to do — is something which needs doing.

Registration fees alone do not cover all our costs. Salkehatchie Summer Service also depends on donations from individuals, classes, and churches. Material donations such as lumber, paint, caulking, plywood, linoleum, paneling, nails, etc., may be brought directly to camp and reported as a donation.



## Good News from the Trustees



Have you noticed how much brighter Asbury Hall is? We want to thank Terry Hicks and members of his family for their hard work in converting the lights in Asbury Hall to LED. Terry will also be working on the lights in the hallways around the Church offices.

If you would like to help with this project, please contact Terry.

### Other exciting news:

Dominion Energy has a program whereby the company will handle the installation of, and pay for businesses to convert to LED lighting up to a maximum of \$6,000 per account per year. LUMC qualifies for this program and since we have two accounts that support our Church location, we can receive a credit of \$12,000. We asked Dominion to provide a quote for replacing the lighting in Wesley Hall since many of the fixtures are burned out due to worn out ballasts and these ballasts are no longer available. The cost to convert the lights to LED is approximately \$15,800. With the Dominion Energy credit, and a generous donation from a member of our congregation, these lights will be converted in the near future at no cost to the Church. We are waiting for Dominion to schedule the installation. **What a Blessing!**

**Thanks to the Trustees who work hard to maintain our building. There is always something that needs a repair and we are grateful to those who are serving on the Trustee Committee for their faithful service.**

Did you know there is a HEPA filter on the air handler in the Sanctuary? This was installed to clean the air during the height of the pandemic.

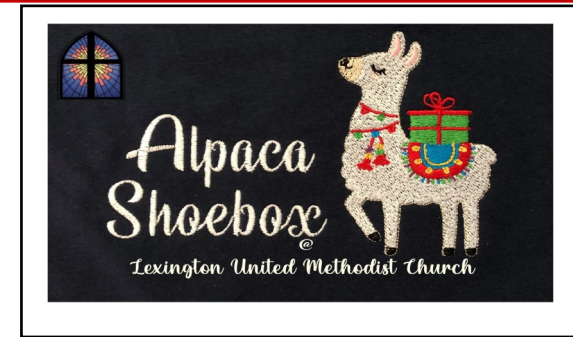



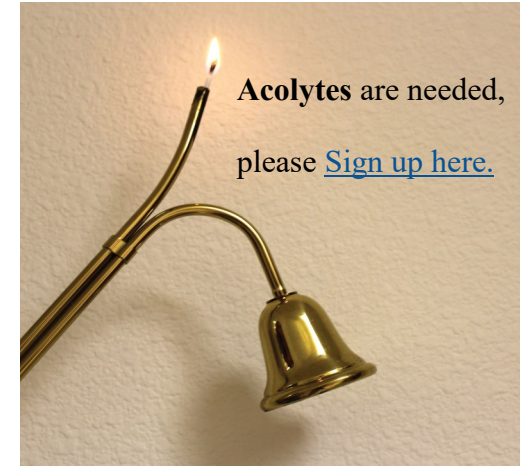
