Lexington United Methodist Church is quickly approaching our 175th anniversary, which will be celebrated in 2025! With humble beginnings in a small log building, our Church has experienced many changes over the years. Through all the changes, we have become a strong family of faith. As we look forward to our 175th year, it is a good time to reflect on the significance of our heritage in shaping who we are today.



Blessings to you, sisters and brothers in Christ at Lexington United Methodist Church! You are a community of great faith and hope, and it was very exciting to experience Holy Week and Easter with you all in April! God has blessed your church in many ways, including a vibrant

congregation, willing volunteers, great outreach programs, wonderful work with children and youth, and generous hearts for Jesus and all of God's people.

The attendance at our Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter services was amazing. Our 7am outside Sunrise service with Holy Communion had 44 worshippers even though it was 44 degrees outside. Our 9am Traditional Easter service with Holy Communion had 213 worshippers, and our 11am Contemporary Easter service with Holy Communion had 94 worshippers. To have 351 attending in total on Easter morning is a huge blessing that we are so grateful to see! I have seen so much being accomplished by you all in what will soon be our first year that I've been with you. I'm so grateful to all the staff and volunteers who worked together to make our mission and ministry so fruitful!

I thank you for all that you are doing as the hands and feet of Jesus Christ. Your church has a wonderful vision to continue fulfilling your mission. That vision is rooted in the acronym "SEE" which has three parts: stewardship, engagement, and education. You have worded it this way: "We will generously and lovingly share our fiscal and physical gifts (Stewardship); We will come together to joyfully serve God, inspire, and accompany one another in our spiritual journey (Engagement); We will intentionally study scripture and communicate effectively to lead others to Christ (Education).

I have seen you doing all those visionary elements together and praise God for the Lord's blessing in our work together. The early church that we read of in the book of Acts certainly prioritized so much of what we think is important at LUMC. You have not allowed yourselves to be overly distracted by changes and outside events, which is quite remarkable. I think that is a very good indicator of a blessed future for our mission and vision as ministers of Christ. Did you Know? By the Numbers:

191- Number of children who lived at Epworth last year, each one from our own communities in SC.

265- Number of children served through Epworth's Foster Care Program

100% - Of your Mother's Day Offering provides comprehensive care for the children at Epworth. Epworth is not an apportioned item in the Annual Conference budget. Mother's Day is your opportunity to support Epworth's ministry.

Epworth Children's Home has been a ministry of our church for more than 127 years. They are not an apportioned item by the SC Conference, which means they receive no funding from the conference other than our offerings. They rely heavily on the donations received from our Mother's Day offering to provide direct care for the children residing at Epworth, as well as for the children and families receiving care and support in Epworth's variety of ministries, from the babies in the Family Care Center to the young adults in Independent Living.

When a child is connected with Epworth, they have experienced a great deal of loss. For Epworth, it isn't enough to answer God's call to care for the least of these by simply providing room and board. They go above and beyond offering the children tutoring to get them caught up at school; counseling to help them heal emotionally; quality medical care, knowing that many of the children have never seen a doctor or dentist. Epworth also offers spiritual formation and guidance that encourages true healing through Christ. Epworth Children's Home ensures the children are surrounded by loving Christian adults so they can break the cycle of abuse, neglect, and shame and replace it with a life of self-respect, responsibility, and productivity.

May 28 is Pentecost Sunday

On Pentecost Sunday, we remember the day the disciples received the Holy Spirit in a special way. The story in Acts 2 describes a powerful wind and tongues of fire as the Holy Spirit was poured out on people from all over the world who came to Jerusalem to celebrate a Jewish feast. At the first Pentecost over 3000 peocreating the ple were baptized, first church. This is why Pentecost is known as the birthday of the Christian church. Pentecost

for Christians culminates the

celebration and work of the church begun on Easter Day.

The color historically associated with Pentecost is red. Red is a visual reminder of the "tongues of fire" that empowered the apostles and others to proclaim the good news of Christ's resurrection in many languages to the crowds of pilgrims from many lands (Acts 2:3).

The Season after Pentecost is the time of the church year to support new disciples and the whole congregation in living out the gifts we have been given in the name of Jesu s and the power of the Holy Spirit.




Children's Sunday school teachers really needed—please help fill up the spring/summer calendar.
