



St. Simons Church, Peak, SC

(A monologue by Clotile Sanford-Hunt)

Welcome to St. Simons Church. I was organized in 1889 but I wasn't built until 1900. In the early 1900s I was a school for black students. I was last an active church in the 1920s.

The reason I am here today is to tell you about the real me, not just the building. I am not just a building made of wood and stone, I am a symbol of strength and hope. Yes, I was a place where people of color could freely come to worship, but I was and still am much more. I provided a shelter in the times of despair and sorrow. People came to me to pray when they needed healing of their soul. They came to me to give thanks for the many blessing that were bestowed on them. They came to me when their loved one passed away and beseeched God to accept them into Heaven. They came to me to celebrate births and wedding and baptisms. As the years passed, fewer people came, but I still stand ready to provided

their needs. My boards may be rotted and the trees and vines nearly hid me, but my foundation is solid. My purpose for being has not diminished. I still reverberate electrifying faith to all who come near. The same faith that each Sunday replenished the souls of those who entered. Filling them with strength to shield themselves from the challenges of the world. Even today if you stand and listen, you can hear whispers of "halleluiah," thank you Lord,". You can feel the silent prayers of the despair and gratitude. Although I might become a pile of crumbled lumber, my spirit is eternal. I will always stand ready to provided for their needs.

Thank you for giving this opportunity to speak to you.

Remember, faith is everlasting.






staff and co-workers. I am forever thankful for the love and grace you showered on me in our short time together. Much love. Pastor Laurie
