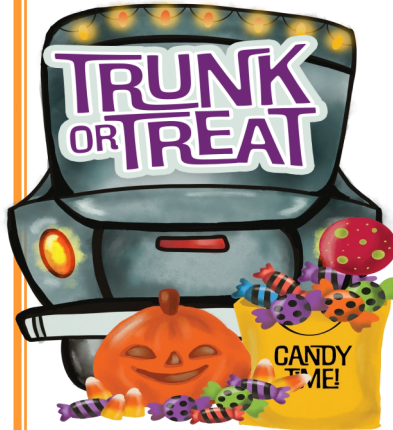

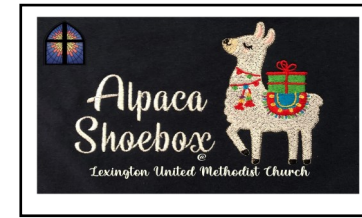

UMVIM Emergency Response Team (ERT) Training

The South Carolina ERT is in need of volunteers to help in the aftermath of disasters and has scheduled several training sessions for volunteer certification. ERT Basic Classes are from 9 -5 and the cost is \$40 per person (which includes a manual, shirt, cap and badge). Classes for renewals run from 9-1 (same dates) and cost \$20. Everyone must also do a background check through UMCOR (which is FREE).

<https://app.verifiedvolunteers.com/en/Candidates/Account/Register> to complete the background check requirement. (If asked for a code use 9x2r4eh.). This background check is mandatory and you cannot get certified without it.

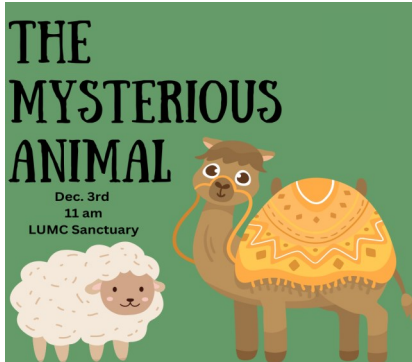
