Church Council members do not forget—

In a box of stuff that I have collected over the years, lies a Roman silver denarius coin from the first century, that came from Israel many years ago. A silver denarius was the equivalent of one day's pay in ancient times, so it was a valuable coin to have! The obverse (front) of the coin bears the side profile of Julius Caesar. On the reverse is the scene of a soldier standing

over two bound captives, with the title "Caesar" across the width of the base. The coin has a hole drilled in the top from where someone apparently once felt compelled to wear it close to their heart on a necklace.

"Give therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's and to God the things that are God's"

Matthew 22:21b

I wonder if the person who had the hole drilled in the coin did so because they wanted to wear it and always remember what Jesus did with Caesar's denarius in Matthew's 22nd chapter. The Herodians and the Pharisees joined togeth-

er to trap Jesus so he could be arrested for either sedition or encouraging tax evasion. When they asked Jesus if it was lawful to pay taxes to Caesar, he simply asked them to produce the denarius, asked them whose image and title it bore, and then told them to "Give therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's and to God the things that are God's."

We take this to mean that because the coin was made in Caesar's image, it is right to use it for Caesar's purposes. But what about you? Whose image were you created in? You were created in God's image. Every person reading these words right now, was created by our awesome and loving God in God's image. Given that, do you give yourself to be used for God's purposes? Do you give the very best of your prayers, your presence, your gifts, your service, and your witness, to God? Sometimes this passage is only interpreted to mean that we should tithe

our money to God.

We certainly should tithe, because Lexington United Methodist Church uses your financial gifts to bless those in need, every day of the year. This passage from Jesus is about more than that, though. It is about you and I giving the very best of ourselves off the top to God first. It is about putting God first in every aspect of our lives. Scripture is filled with references to giving the "first fruits' of the harvest back to God before anything else is taken. Do you do that with the gifts that God gives you? One way of helping your church do that for the community is to tithe 10% of your disposable income to your church.

In a few weeks, you will receive a pledge card from LUMC asking how much you can pledge to tithe for the coming year 2024. As your pastor, I have continued to tithe at least 10% of my income, both my church salary and my Army pension, to your church. I keep the other 90% for the things I need to do with my family. I am comforted to know that God can do much more with the 10% than with the 90%. When you get your pledge card, it is not required for you to sign your name in the space allocated, before you return it to us. You know what you have contracted with the Lord, and that is good enough.

We are grateful for all that you return to the church, from what God has blessed you with. So much is done with what you give, including ministries for the marginalized and hungry, counseling for those who have lost their way, help for struggling families, support for world-wide ministries and missions, multiple weekly worship services, children's and youth activities, and community events in your church. The list goes on and on. All of these are possible because you, who are created in God's beautiful image, are willing to be used for God's purposes. Thanks be to God!


How many recycled plastic grocery bags are filled with food and handed out on the mobile food pantry each month?

What is a Spiral Walk?

A small, calm and quiet walk on a spiral path giving you time to reflet on Jesus bringing His light into the world, as you walk through the path and back out.

You are invited to visit the reflection stations as you move to the spiral candlelight walk.



How can we re-orient ourselves towards longing this Advent?

One of the ways we reflect on Advent in communal worship is by utilizing an Advent wreath--a simple wreath surrounding four exterior candles and one central candle. The four exterior candles represent the hallmarks of a renewed creation: *joy, hope, peace and love.* The central candle represents the presence of Christ. Each Sunday, one more of the exterior candles is lit.

Finally, the Christ candle is lit as a reminder of Christ's ongoing presence. We can bring this practice home, creating our own Advent wreaths and contemplating our own longings for more *joy, hope, peace and love*.

Devotionals present weekly or daily opportunities to focus on a topic. Our friends at UpperRoom.org offer <u>a free daily devotional</u> that is Advent-focused during this season. CommonPrayer.net. <u>It offers daily prayers</u> speaking into our Advent expectations during






Did you pick up a Christmas Jar to fill and give away during Advent time?


