

40 DAYS OF PREPARATION – THE LENTEN SEASON

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word lencten, meaning "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of spring. The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of selfexamination and reflection. In the early church, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by new converts and then became a time of penance by all Christians. Today, Christians focus on relationship with God, growing as disciples and extending ourselves, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of ourselves for others.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter." This is why you will see the designation "Sunday in Lent" rather than "Sunday of Lent" in the naming of these Sundays. On each Lord's Day in Lent, while Lenten fasts continue, the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.



Outreach Opportunities

SNACK SACK MINISTRY

Many children in our community rely on school meals to get enough to eat during the school year. During weekends and holidays, they may receive little or nothing to eat at home. Together with local schools and our generous donors, the Snack Sack ministry at Lexington UMC provides 500-600 schoolaged children from 7 schools with a bag full of healthy food and snacks every

week during the school year so they have enough to eat over the weekend. This ministry, which cost over \$60,000 in 2023 to operate, would not be possible without the generous donations of this congregation and many others.

Snack Sack also relies on numerous volunteers from LUMC and the community to shop for food items, unload trucks and pallets, organize and pack items into grocery bags, and deliver bags to schools. Additional volunteers are needed on Tuesday mornings at 10 AM to help pack items and on Wednesdays to deliver food to schools. ALPACA SHOEBOX
