A WORD FROM PASTOR MACK

Blessings to you, sisters and brothers in Christ at Lexington United Methodist Church! Mother's Day, which is observed every second Sunday of May, will be here on May 12th. It is usually a pretty full church day, so come early to get a good seat! It is important to remember that Mother's Day began as a liturgical service in a Methodist church! For this reason, we will recognize mothers on that day and share also in the sacrament of Holy Communion.


Don't forget that Father's Day is just around the corner, and we will recognize fathers on June 16, 2024. In 1972, Father's Day became an official U.S. holiday. Just as two Methodist women are credited with creating the Mother's Day holiday in the U.S., the inspiration for Father's Day also came from a Methodist woman, Grace Golden Clayton.

Grace was the youngest of 11 children born to an ordained Methodist pastor, Rev. Fletcher Golden. In the early 1900s, Grace was living in West Virginia when tragedy struck nearby. On December 6th, 1907, the deadliest mining accident in history rocked the little town of Monongah, killing more than 360 men. The vibrations were felt for miles and left over 1000 children fatherless. Grace suggested to her minister, Dr. Thomas Webb, that a service be held to honor all those men who had died in the mines. Grace chose the date July 5th because it was the Sunday closest to her father's birthday.

The Rev. Fletcher Golden had passed away about 10 years earlier and served appointments at nearby Methodist churches after serving as a justice of the peace and a soldier in the Civil War. Isn't it interesting to know that Methodist women initiated both Mother's Day and Father's Day? We are grateful for the influence of loving mothers, fathers and families which makes us a very tight and loving church family here in LUMC! I appreciate what you all do very much!

Wonder Sheets are a way for even the youngest in the congregation to engage in worship. They change with the changes of seasons in the church calendar and include a seasonal image to color. Children can color in music notes as they hear songs, draw the banner at the front of the worship space, color in the liturgical color, and locate the scripture. Children are also encouraged to dive deeper with the "I Wonder..." section on the back. They can use this space to take sermon notes, ask questions about what they've heard, or even just write down their wonderings. Any Wonder Sheets left behind are collected and added to our Wonder Binder! Children are able to look at the Wonder Binder during Sunday School time or Sunday Evening Programming and provide another way for us to grow and connect with God.
