



A WORD FROM PASTOR MACK

Blessings to you, sisters and brothers in Christ at Lexington United Methodist Church! Father’s Day is just around the corner! We will recognize fathers on June 16, 2024. Father’s Day became an official U.S. holiday in 1972. Just as two Methodist women are credited with creating the Mother’s Day holiday in the U.S., the inspiration for Father’s Day also came from a Methodist woman, Grace Golden Clayton. Isn’t it interesting to know that Methodist women initiated both Mother’s Day and Father’s Day? As we praise the importance of fathers, there is a father often forgotten in the Methodist church whom we should remember, Francis Asbury, the father of Methodism in America.

Francis Asbury can be considered the George Washington of American Christianity. Although Francis Asbury did not command a military force, he commanded a spiritual force which transformed the hearts and souls of almost an entire nation. In 1771 when Asbury arrived in America, sent by John Wesley, American Methodists numbered only around 300 members. By the time of Asbury’s death, the Methodist Church he birthed numbered more than 214,000 members. In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge gave a dynamic speech about Francis Asbury, naming him as “One of the builders of our nation.” What helped make Francis Asbury an American favorite was the fact that he was known by almost everyone in our growing nation.

Asbury’s travels from Maine to Georgia, from Maryland to Virginia, and from Tennessee to Kentucky made him a household name. He preached and taught in many towns. If there wasn’t a Francis Asbury, there might have been no American Methodism. But there are also many who acknowledge that without Francis Asbury, there might be a very limited American Christianity. Many of the qualities of American Christianity originated with the efforts of Francis Asbury and the thousands of traveling preachers he sent to spread the life-giving message of the Gospel. I appreciate what you all do in LUMC, as you too labor to spread the life-giving message of the Gospel. May God continue to bless our church and our efforts for Jesus!

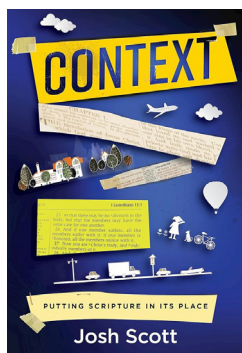

Alpaca Shoebox



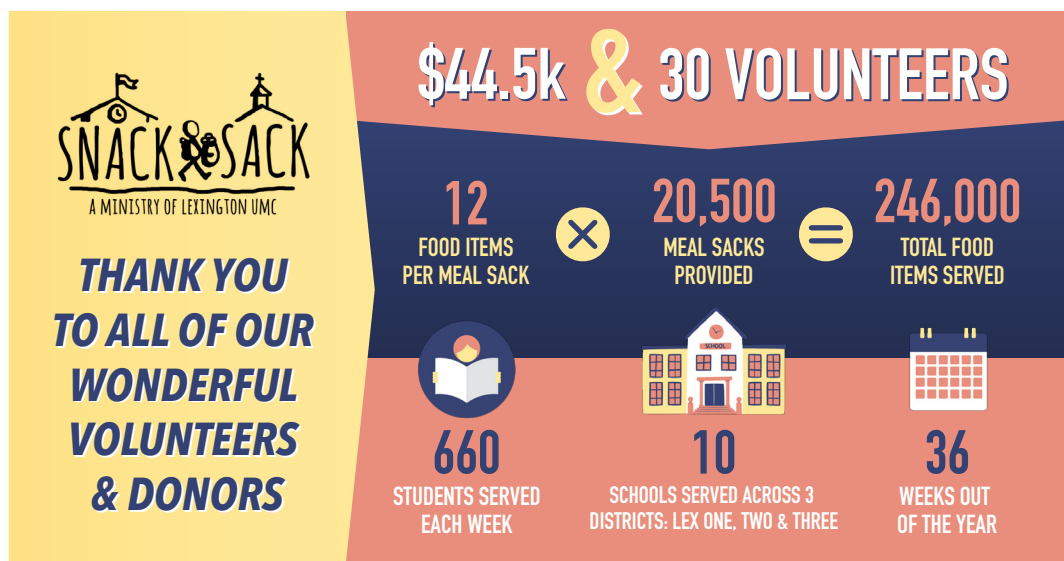

Killingsworth Offers Hope for Recovery

KILLINGSWORTH
transforming women

Excerpt taken from United Women in Faith's May/June issue of response, written by Audrey Stanton-Smith. Read the full story [here](#).

...*Killingsworth* is a United Women in Faith National Mission Institution in Columbia, South Carolina. Inside this eight-bedroom brick home, [Marley] Meschwitz lives with other women in transition. Some have been in jail. Some are battling addiction. Some have been victims of sex trafficking. All of them are loved.

Susan Sirmons, executive director of Killingsworth, says she has a mission to transform the lives of women and to educate the community on matters of mental health and addiction.

TRANSFORMATIONS

Killingsworth began in the 1940s when Corrie Killingsworth, who answered phones at Washington Street Methodist Church, kept getting calls from parents looking for a safe place for their daughters to board while attending business or nursing school in Columbia.

Times were changing, and Killingsworth was inspired to help these young women make their own way. So, she rallied women from Methodist churches in the area, and they raised funds to purchase and renovate a house, which opened in 1947 as a boarding house for Christian girls.

...Times and society changed again. By the early 1970s, there were fewer young women in need of a boarding house and more young women in need of help with issues like alcoholism, drug addiction, prison release, and domestic violence. ... Since 1972, Killingsworth has helped hundreds of women live safely and soberly while undergoing counseling and learning the skills that help them get back on their feet.

Sarah Hickey is one of them. Hickey had been at Killingsworth only three months when she was interviewed for this article. "It was like a weight taken off my shoulders when I got accepted here," she said. "This is where I need to be, and I love it here."

EDUCATING OTHERS

...As part of her ministry —Sirmons returned to staff in retirement after she found herself volunteering at Killingsworth more than 30 hours a week—she educates not only residents, but those in the community about substance use disorder.

"I tell my women all the time, it's so important to educate yourself. And my goal is to educate the community on addiction and mental health," Sirmons said. "Addiction is a disease. And, like diabetes or high blood pressure, we push people to get treatment."

At Killingsworth, residents have mental health counseling, individual outpatient treatment plans, support for finding employment, support when cravings and triggers arise, and hope.

"Killingsworth helps you with anything and everything that you need," said Cherry Orellana, 48, who came to Killingsworth last fall straight from a prison addiction treatment unit. She began working at a local pet supply store after only a week in Killingsworth.
