A WORD FROM PASTOR MACK

Blessings to you, sisters and brothers in Christ at Lexington United Methodist Church! We have been blessed to see the results of our United Methodist Church South Carolina Annual Conference witnessed by our Lay Delegates. From June 8-11, Pastor Meegian and I attended the Annual Conference at the Greenville Convention Center, along with Buddy Brewer, Lessie Polk, Susan Matthews, Susan Mitton, Maddie Connor, Wells Carter, and Wanda Pettus. We were blessed to hear some wonderful sermons from talented proclaimers, including our own Resident Bishop, Leonard Fairley, along with others including Rev. Kathryn Bariou, who has roots in LUMC.



Important business was acted upon, including voting on regionalization and amendments to our denomination's constitution: expanding gender and disability inclusion in church membership; standing against racism and colonialism; and clarifying requirements for clergydelegate elections. The amendments all passed by the required two-thirds at the 2024 General Conference. Since all Annual Conferences need to vote, and achieve a two-thirds majority to

pass, it will be a while before the results of the total votes are known. The standing rules involving years of service and numbers of people required on conference boards and agencies were slightly modified to accommodate a smaller pool of available applicants.

The Council on Finance and Administration (CF&A) offered a reduced budget of \$10.3 million for 2026. Your Lay Delegates who attended with Pastor Meegian and I will brief each LUMC worship service on the major points of the Annual Conference. I appreciate what you all do in LUMC, as you labor to spread the life-giving message of the Gospel. May God continue to bless our church and our efforts for Jesus!
