A Word from Pastor Mack

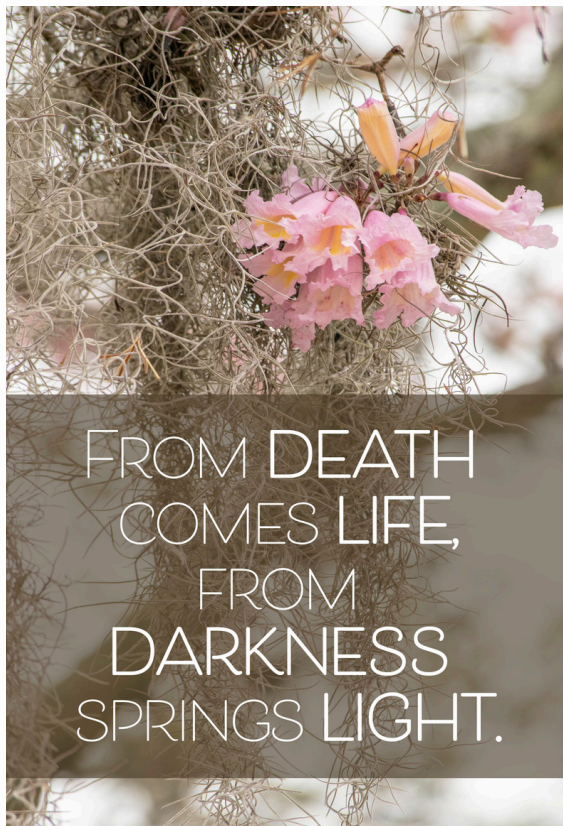
Blessings to you, sisters and brothers in Christ at Lexington United Methodist Church!

We are looking forward to sharing Holy Week with you through our services on Maundy Thursday (2 April), Good Friday (3 April), Blessing of the Animals (Saturday, 4 April), and all 3 Easter Sunday services (7:00 am Sunrise service, (9:00 am in the sanctuary, and 11:00 am in Wesley Hall.)

We are also excited that we are approaching Mother's Day, which is observed every second Sunday of May. Before you know it, it will be here on 10 May! Mother's Day is usually a pretty-full church day, so come early to get a good seat! In the United States, the quest for a recognized Mother's Day began in 1905 under the encouragement of Anna Jarvis. Anna initiated the first Mother's Day service of worship at Andrews Methodist Episcopal Church in West Virginia. Anna's campaign for a day to honor the influence of all mothers began the same year her own mother Ann passed. Ann Jarvis was a very influential peace activist and health advocate, who had cared for wounded Civil War Soldiers from both sides. By 1911, all US states recognized the holiday. It is important to remember that Mother's Day began as a liturgical service in a Methodist church! For this reason, we will have a recognition of mothers on that day and share also in the sacrament of Holy Communion. We are grateful for the loving influence of all the mothers in our church and community! We are also grateful to be a very tight and loving church family here in LUMC, and I appreciate what you all do, very much!

Church Vows

Do you remember the different ways you support Lexington UMC?

When we take the baptismal and local church membership vows, we agree to covenant with God and the members of the local church to keep the vows that are part of living the baptismal covenant and reception into membership in the local church.

These vows have four parts: (1) to confess Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior; (2) to believe in the Christian faith as contained in the Old and New Testaments; (3) to support The United Methodist Church; and (4) to uphold the local congregation with our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness.

We are a supportive, praying congregation. We serve through the missions we support, we witness to our community through our mission work and sharing our good works with the community. Are you present?

Why do we give?



John Wesley offers this plain approach to living: We are to seek to earn all we can in ways that are helpful to ourselves and others, never harmful. We are to “save all we can” by being frugal in our expenses. And then having earned all we can and spent only what we must to care for our own basic needs and those of our family (which we are never to neglect!), we are to give everything else away.

As United Methodists we value the tithe as a benchmark for giving. We believe our giving should be both more challenging and more gracious to the whole world than simply trying to give a tithe of our income.

We also believe that there is joy in giving, and the greater the generosity the deeper the joy. We acknowledge that we worship God and not money! Giving an offering frees us from the bondage that money can have over our lives. Tithing then encourages us to focus on God as the source of our strength and abundance, rather than our own achievements or financial assets. Tithing leads to our spiritual well-being and growth in our relationship with God and others in the world around us.

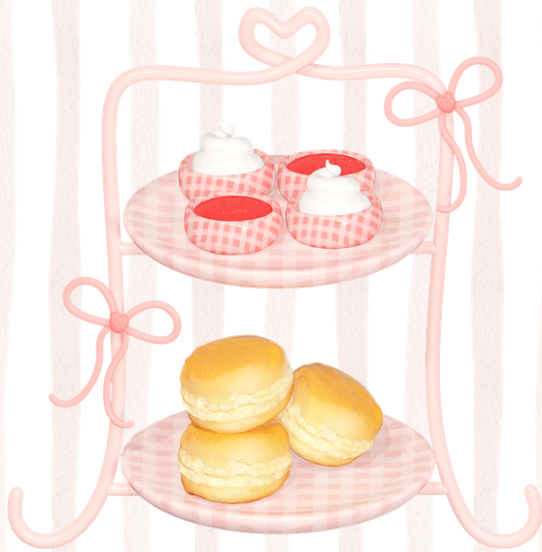

BIKE4LIFE 2026



My name is Hannah Vitters, and I am a Junior at Lexington High School. I am raising awareness for a cause near and dear to my heart.

I host an annual bikeathon fundraiser called **Bike4Life**, this year being the third event. The driving force behind this fundraiser is my 9-year-old cousin Jack Timmerman, who was diagnosed with Batten Disease in late 2023. This is an extremely rare neurological disorder that has already caused Jack almost complete blindness, with many more symptoms expected in the next few years he has been given to live.

The year I founded Bike4Life, I wanted to do something for him that not only helps Batten Disease patients but also all kids and families struggling with childhood illnesses and life-threatening diseases. In the last two years combined, I have raised over \$5,700 for Ronald McDonald House Charities and Make-A-Wish Foundation.



The 2026 Bike4Life is **May 2nd**, in the LUMC parking lot.

The event starts at 9:00 with the trike race beginning at 9:15 (but participants should be there 15 minutes before their event).

There are events designated for specific age groups all morning, with the last one ending at 12:00pm.

Food trucks will be at the event until 12:30!

The entry fee is \$25 per person donated online to the Pathways SC Bike4Life donation page, with a limit of \$75 in entry fees per family.

If you have more than 3 kids who would like to join us, entry fees are not required past the \$75. T-shirt cost is included in the entry fee, and all participants who register **before April 15** are guaranteed a Bike4Life t-shirt! There will be extras available on May 2nd; however, there will be a limited supply, so sign up ASAP!

All attendees will also be entered into the live raffle with prizes from various businesses in Lexington, including but not limited to Bella Nails and Spa, the Kindred Boutique, and Pelican SnoBalls.
